
- 1. Leadership that creates a culture of challenge

Gardening Group


Firstly a big thank you to all our dedicated gardeners.



HSC Visual Arts Student Visits to Newcastle Gallery

Students also had the opportunity to engage in a unique virtual-reality project developed in conjunction with the exhibition *SODEISHA*: connected to Australia. The aim of this project is to introduce showcase works of art from the Newcastle Art Gallery collection and to demonstrate to secondary school students the capacity of Virtual Reality projects within cultural institutions.


Art Squad:

PDHPE Report

What's Happening

Practical 7-10 PDHPE classes have been working through the **Hitting Skills, Athletics and Gymnastics Units**, where students have demonstrated some outstanding hand-eye coordination and transferral of movement skills in a variety of contexts; including, Speedminton, Javelin and Mini Tramp. Students in Year 8 and 10 have been assessed on their run, jump and throw technique during the Athletics Unit while the Year 7 and 9 cohorts have been assessed on their balance, form and safety on the beam and tramps during the Gymnastics unit.



Theoretical 7-10 PDHPE classes have been slightly different this year with the New K-10 PDHPE Syllabus being implemented for Year 7 and 9 in 2019, Year 8 and 10 will follow in 2020. The units of work scope and sequence can be seen on pages 19 and 20. Some major highlight for the term included the Year 7 **This Is Me** Assessment Task where students created a detailed collage about their authentic self and the **Unsociable Media** Task for Year 9 where students were required to respond to the "Like A Girl" stimulus in order to reflect on the impact of the media and gender stereotypes have on sense of self in current society.



The **Preliminary PDHPE** class have been working steadily through the **Better Health for Individuals** Unit of work, developing a sound understanding of the determinants of health, the Ottawa Charter for health promotion and the principles of social justice. Mr Anderson has been exposing the group to a variety of collaborative teaching and learning strategies which will be reinforced during the camp at Milson's Island where various aspects of the **Outdoor Recreation** Unit will be addressed in a practical and hands on manner.

The *HSC PDHPE* class are busy reflecting on their Assessment Task 2 results where they were required to respond to a range of HSC Style Questions from the *Factors Affecting Performance* Unit. The class is developing steadily with the initiation of early morning study sessions that focus on specific content knowledge, addressing key verbs and sentence structure for short and extended response questions. Mr McCafferty's wealth of knowledge and experience as an elite coach in the local community will no doubt be utilised in the upcoming *Improving Performance* Unit where students will design and implement specific training programs for a variety of athletes.



PDHPE Report



The Yr11 and Yr12 SLR classes are both extremely motivated and engaged in 2019 with a variety of innovative teaching and learning strategies being utilised during their lessons. Mr See has implemented the evidenced based research program "Burn to Learn", where students perform various HITT workouts at the beginning of lessons in order to enhance cognitive function and the retainment of lesson content. Student performance data is tracked using current technology; including, pedometers, HR monitors and IPAD with B2L Applications. This has enabled the students to grasp a deeper understanding of concepts during the Racquet Sports and Fitness Testing units of work, while increasing their physical activity levels. This was

evident during the assessment tasks where students were able to demonstrate a high level of skill and understanding against a highly subjective and detailed marking rubric.

PDHPE electives have been extremely popular in 2019 with a significant increase in student numbers and classes offered. These include **Yr8 Human Movement, Yr9 PASS** (3 classes) and **Yr10 PASS** (2 classes). All groups have been exposed to a variety of hands on and practical based learning experiences that expand on the traditional 7-10 PDHPE Programs and lead students into some exciting topics such as; **Body Systems/Anatomy, Australia's Sporting Identity** and **Coaching for Improved Performance.** The Year 9 cohort are preparing for their Coaching Session Assessment Task where they will be required to plan, implement and evaluate a skill based session for their peers while the Year 10 group have been lucky enough to have a member of the local community come in and deliver a specific coaching session on AFL, highlighting the key skills of the sport and significance to the Australian culture. Mr McCafferty's Human Movement crew have been studying the human anatomy and identifying the muscles and bones required to improve performance in a variety of sporting contexts. Teachers of these courses are always looking at providing engaging and meaningful learning experiences for the students within the local community, so keep an eye out for some exciting excursions from this group of electives!


Computing @ NHS




